



Position Available – Fleet Captain

Below is a very extensive description of the Fleet Captain Position. Please talk to myself, or any member of the bridge if you have questions or are interested in finding out more about this role.

Often seen as an entry position onto the bridge, the Fleet Captain's main role is to reach out to the Fleet Captains of the other 31 clubs within the AYC and to lead our Fleet.

There are many parties and get togethers, with the other Fleet Captains. Visiting other clubs and "stealing" their burgees is an honourable goal with the objective of "inviting" Fleet Captains from other clubs to come to our "home" to visit and retrieve their burgee (and "steal" one of ours). There is an AYC dinner meeting near the end of each month to solidify connections, and a roll call of what burgee's you have accumulated is one of the highlights. You will become familiar with all of the US Boat Clubs within the AYC and better yet, you will be welcomed as one of their own.





There are five AYC Poker Runs held throughout the summer at different clubs to coincide with their Regattas which is a great party by itself, often with hundreds in attendance. The goal is to attend as many as possible with as many boats and friends from our club as you can, to collect points. There are monetary prizes awarded at the end of the year for best poker hands, burgees for perfect attendance and most attended from a club (the more boats & friends you bring with you the better) as well as various trophies. In your role as Fleet Captain, you will lead the charge and may even become Fleet Captain of the year!

We hold our own Regatta as well, in August and you will be involved in the set up and hosting of this event along with a lot of other experienced members of our club.



Last year we spent one weekend at Sarnia Bay Marina, one at Elba Mar and one at Sunseekers and they were all a blast.





With the assistance of our Past Commodores and bridge members, you will organize our Blessing of the Fleet held in May. Anyone who wants to participate meets at our home marina. We then parade up river, with a slow pass by our Fleet Chaplain, Fr. Stan Fraser who blesses all boats. We then make our way back to Holiday Harbour, where our Clubhouse is, for a BBQ. We usually offer free boat inspections by Windsor Power & Sail Squadron and invite local water rescue, fire & police boat services for a meet & greet.

This is a position that can be shared by two friends and as an entry level, you will receive a lot of help and advice from our Past Commodores who have been there and done that. As you move through the ranks up to Commodore, most other AYC Club's Fleet Captains will do the same, thus establishing life-long connections and friendships.
